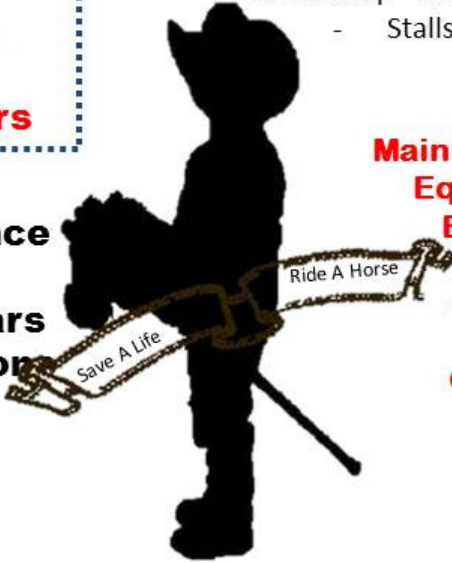

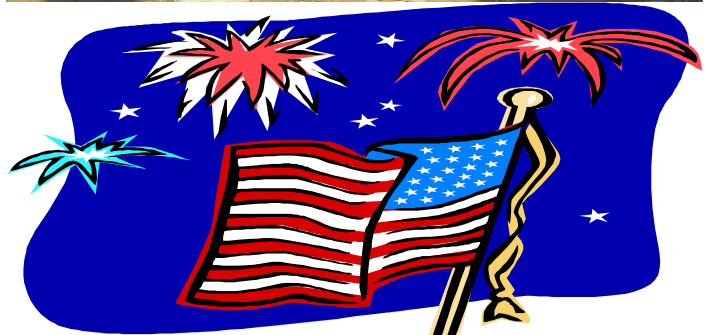

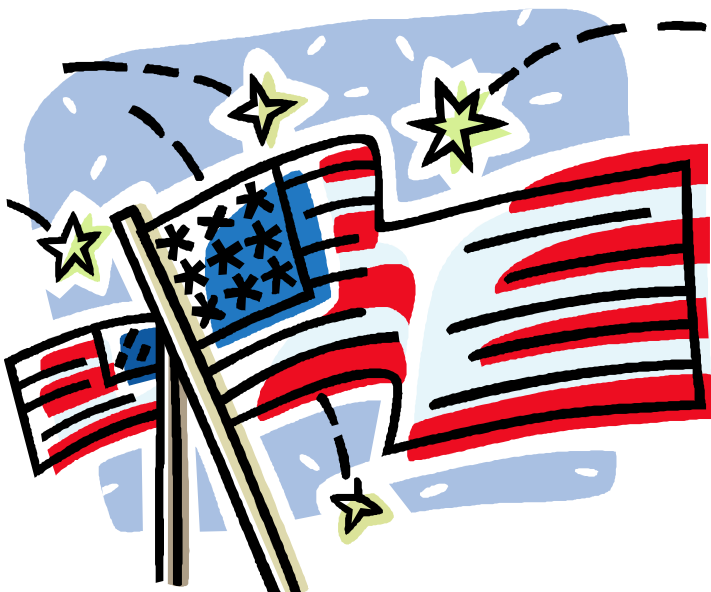

AWARD COMPONENTS:

Each year the AASP & RC will award two \$1,000 scholarships to any applicants who meet the award criteria.

AWARD CRITERIA:

- 1) Applicants must be a member of the AASP & RC for two consecutive years in which the award is received.
- 2) Applicants must submit the completed Biographical Questionnaire, two letters of reference from AASP & RC members and a one page essay on the question provided in the Questionnaire.
- 3) Scholarship recipients must provide proof of enrollment/registration at an accredited, post-secondary institution (two/four year collage/university or vocational training program prior to receiving the scholarship award.
- 4) Applicants must mail all documents (application, two letters of reference and essay) with a postmark on or prior to July 31, 2013 to the Scholarship
